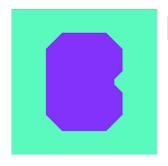

#### **General Information**

This documentation contains important information that you must observe when following the descriptions. The information is highlighted as notes and arranged according to type and importance. The notes are listed below in ascending order of importance:

#### O TIP

This represents **no risk**. In addition to the classic clicking on options, Business Central also offers the option of using so-called shortcuts. Shortcuts are key combinations with which you can also execute the desired action in the user interface. By using shortcuts, you can work faster and more effectively. Try the key combination and you will be surprised how much faster you can work.

#### **6** NOTE

This represents **no risk**. This note contains important information on the correct use, configuration or operation of the software. Follow these instructions to avoid inefficiencies and unnecessary support tickets. For example, this note can show you that an option is hidden and tells you how to proceed if you want to show it again.

#### 1 IMPORTANT

This represents a **low risk**. This notice refers to non-critical issues that may lead to undesired behavior or configuration problems. May affect user experience or functionality if not considered.

#### **A** CAUTION

This represents a **medium risk**. This notice indicates a potential problem that could affect system stability or data integrity.

Failure to comply may result in errors, loss of performance or partial service interruptions. The errors caused by non-compliance only affect the app itself and prevent you from working with data within the app.

#### A WARNING

This represents a high risk. This notice indicates an immediate and serious risk to the productive system.

Failure to observe this warning may affect the entire system. There is a risk of loss of critical data or total system failure, leading to prolonged downtime. It may not be possible to restore the data and a backup must be imported.

Beyond Price Changes is an extension for Microsoft Dynamics 365 Business Central.

**Beyond Price Changes** allows you to define individual markups for items based on item quantities, item prices and customers. Markups can be applied as a percentage markup, fixed price, or blended markup in sales and service documents.

No dependencies from or to other apps

No additional, basic applications are required to use **Beyond Price Changes**.

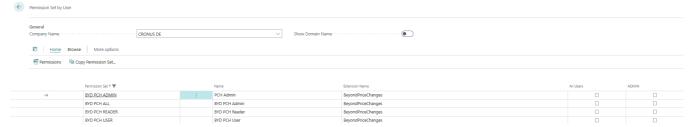
## Assign User Permissions

The following description shows how to assign user permissions for the **Beyond Price Changes** extension. The permission sets provided are:

Permission Set	Description	
BYD PCH All	This permission set enables the use of the <b>Beyond Price Changes</b> extension. With this permission set, all permissions are assigned without any restrictions.	
BYD PCH Admin	This permission set gives the assigned user administrative access to the <b>Beyond Price Changes</b> extension.	
BYD PCH Reader	This permission set enables the reading of data from the <b>Beyond Price Changes</b> extension.	
BYD PCH User	This permission set enables the use of the <b>Beyond Price Changes</b> extension at user level. In this permission set, the setup is excluded, i.e. the user has access to the functions, but not to the setup the app.	

To assign the permission set for **Beyond Price Changes** to a user, proceed as follows:

- 1. Open the search function from the role center (ALT+Q).
- 2. Search for **Permission Sets** and click on the appropriate search result.
- 3. The **Permission Sets** page is displayed.
- 4. Select one of the above permission sets from the list.
- 5. Click **Related > Permissions > Permission Set by User** in the menu bar.



- 6. The **Permission Set by User** page is displayed.
- 7. Show the filter area (SHIFT+F3) and pick Extension Name and the value Beyond Price Changes as filter criteria.
- 8. The list is filtered to the permission sets of **Beyond Price Changes**.
- 9. Select the check box on the right side of the page for the user or users to whom you want to assign the permission set.

You have assigned a permission set for **Beyond Price Changes** to a user. Note that users with the **SUPER** permission set have all rights, i.e. you do not need to give this user any additional rights.

## Define Item Quantity Groups

This chapter describes how to define one or more item quantity groups. The item quantity groups are used in **Beyond Price Changes** to define a markup based on certain quantities of an item.

#### 1 IMPORTANT

#### **Item Quantities and Partial Quantities**

You can later use the item quantity groups in the markup matrix to define whether a specific markup should be used for a combination of item quantity and/or item price. When creating the item quantity groups, please note that you may also take partial item quantities into account (e.g. 0.5 L oil or other containers).

#### ( IMPORTANT

#### **Creating Item Quantity Groups**

When creating multiple item quantity groups, please note that the range is always defined between two groups. You can find more information on this in the screenshots under the **Description** column. There is a start and an end for the corresponding item quantity range, which you define via the data records.

To define one or more item quantity groups, proceed as follows:

- 1. Open the search function from the role center (ALT+Q).
- 2. Search for Item Quantity Groups and click on the corresponding search result.
- 3. The Item Quantity Groups list is displayed.



- 4. To create a new item quantity group, click on the **New** option in the menu bar.
- 5. Enter a code for the item quantity group under the **Code** column.
- 6. Enter the item quantity in the **Quantity** column. Start by entering the largest item quantity and define the range down to the smallest item quantity you are trading. Further information and an example can be found at the end of this section or in the screenshot below.
- 7. Enter a description for the item quantity group in the **Description** column.



In our example, we have created the following item price groups:

Code	Quantity	Description
BIG	10.00	from a quantity of 10.00
MEDIUM	5.00	from a quantity of 5.00 to 9.99
SMALL	0.01	from a quantity of 0.01 to 4.99

You have defined one or more item quantity groups.

## Define Item Price Groups

This chapter describes how to define one or more item price groups. The item price groups are used in **Beyond Price**Changes to define a markup based on item prices. In combination with item quantity groups, complex markup combinations can also be mapped via **Beyond Price Changes**.

#### ( IMPORTANT

#### **Creating Item Price Groups**

When creating multiple item price groups, please note that the range is always defined between two groups. You can find more information on this in the screenshots under the **Description** column. There is a start and an end for the corresponding item price range, which you define via the data records.

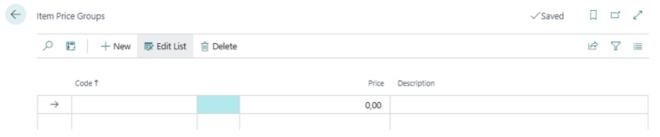
#### 6 NOTE

#### **Item Price Group MAX already exists**

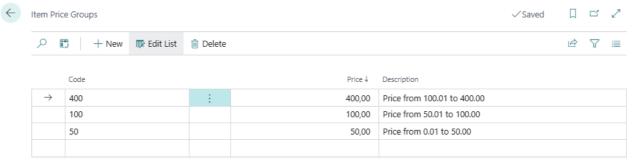
The system already inserts an item price group with the code **MAX**. This item price group includes all prices above the maximum price group you have created. The item price group **Max** is not displayed by default.

To define one or more item price groups, proceed as follows:

- 1. Open the search function from the role center (ALT+Q).
- 2. Search for Item Price Groups and click on the corresponding search result.
- 3. The Item Price Groups page is displayed.



- 4. Click on **New** in the menu bar to define a new item price group.
- 5. Enter a code for the item price group in the **Code** column.
- 6. Enter the price in the **Price** column. The price entered in this field indicates the end point of the price band. If you have not yet defined an item price group and enter a value of **50.00**, an item price group will be created that is valid from **0.01** to **50.00**. Further information and an example can be found at the end of this section or in the screenshot below.
- 7. Enter a description for the item quantity group in the **Description** column.



In our example, we have created the following item price groups:

Code	Price	Description
50	50.00	Price from 0.01 to 50.00
100	100.00	Price from 50.01 to 100.00
400	400.00	Price from 100.01 to 400.00

MAX	>400.01	All prices from 400.01

You have defined one or more item price groups.

## Setup Beyond Price Changes

This chapter describes how to set up Beyond Price Changes.

The contents of this chapter are divided into the following sections:

## **Create Rounding Method**

This section describes how to create a rounding method.

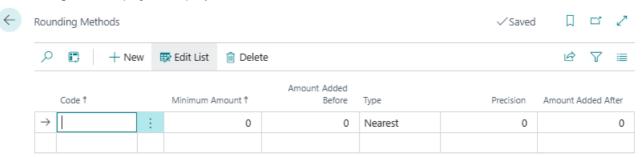
#### O NOTE

#### Rounding method required for setup

Specifying a rounding method is required when setting up **Beyond Price Changes** to define how prices should be rounded. If you have already created a rounding method that you also want to use for markup, you can skip this section.

To create a rounding method, proceed as follows:

- 1. Open the search function from the role center (ALT+Q).
- 2. Search for Rounding Methods and click on the corresponding search result.
- 3. The **Rounding Methods** page is displayed.



- 4. Select the **New** option from the menu bar.
- 5. Enter a code for the new rounding method to be created in the **Code** column.
- 6. Enter the minimum amount for rounding under the Minimum amount column.
- 7. Under the Amount added before column, enter the amount to be added to the price before it is rounded.
- 8. Select the rounding type under the **Type** column. The following options are available to you:
  - **Nearest**: With this type, the amount is rounded commercially, i.e. a decimal place value of 0, 1, 2, 3 or 4 is rounded down and a decimal place value of 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 is rounded up.
  - **Up**: With this type, the amount is always rounded up.
  - **Down**: With this type, the amount is always rounded down.
- 9. Under the **Precision** column, enter a value that specifies the number of decimal places (e.g. 0.00000). A maximum of 5 decimal places is possible.
- 10. Under the **Amount Added After** column, enter the amount that will be added to the price after it has been rounded.

You have created a rounding method.

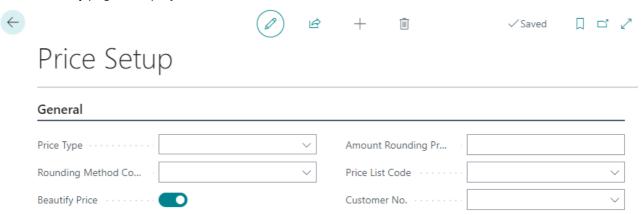
## **Markup Setup**

This section describes how to set up markups.

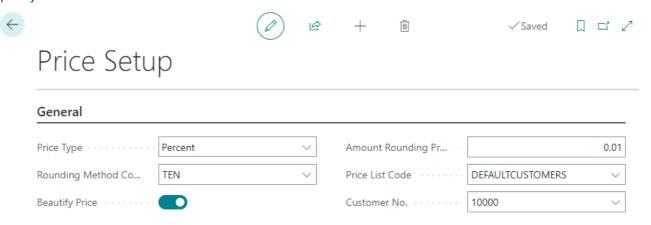
To set up the markups, proceed as follows:

1. Open the search from the role center (ALT+Q).

- 2. Search for **Price Setup** and click on the appropriate search result.
- 3. The **Price Setup** page is displayed.



- 4. From the available options for the **Price Type** field, select the way you want to apply markups to prices. The following options are available:
  - **Absolute**: Use this price type if you want to use a fixed amount for the markup.
  - **Percent**: Use this price type if you want to use a percentage amount for the markup calculated from the item price.
  - **Mixed**: Use this price type if you want to use a mixed amount for the markup. After selecting this option, an additional field (**Price mechanism**) id displayed, which will be used for configuration.
- 5. In the **Rounding Method** field, specify a method that will be used to round the amounts.
- 6. If you want to "beautify" the prices, activate the **Beautify Price** slider. Instead of round amounts, the applied prices are lowered with this setting, i.e. beautified from, for example, 12.00 USD to 11.99 USD.
- 7. In the **Amount Rounding Precision** field, specify a value which is applied to round the amounts.
- 8. In the **Price List Code** field, specify a price list to be used for markups.
- 9. Specify a customer in the **Customer number** field.



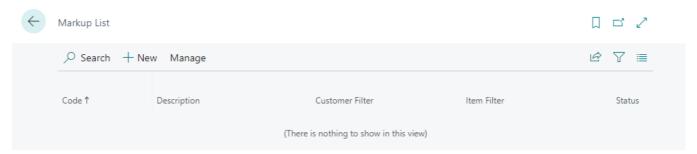

## Setup Markup

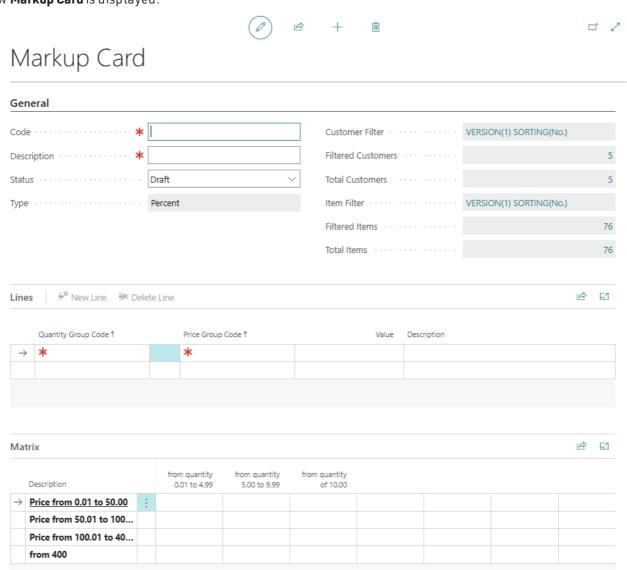
This chapter describes how to set up a percentage markup.

To set up a percentage markup, proceed as follows:

- 1. Open the search function from the role center (ALT+Q).
- 2. Search for Markup List and click on the corresponding search result.
- 3. The Markup List is displayed.



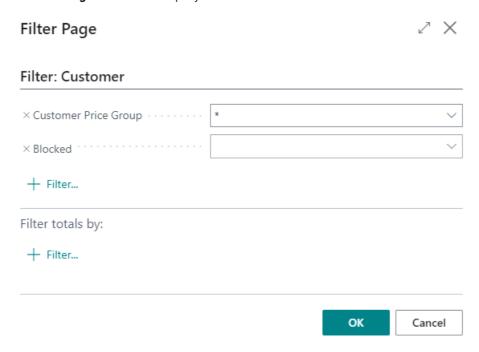
- 4. Click on **New** in the menu bar.
- 5. A new Markup Card is displayed.



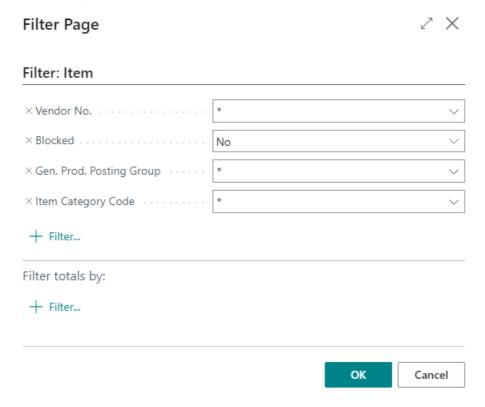
- 6. Enter a code for the markup to be configured in the Code field.
- 7. Enter a suitable name for the markup in the **Description** field.
- 8. Leave the **Status** field at **Draft** for the time being. With this setting, you activate the configured markup.
- 9. The value in the **Type** field is automatically determined by the system based on the setup. Further information on the value displayed in this field can be found in the chapter Setup Markup.
- 10. Click in the **Customer Filter** field to use the filter to determine the customers to which this markup should be

applied.

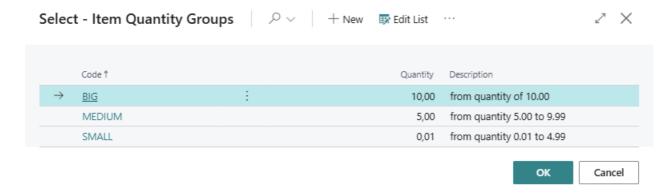
11. The **Filter Page** window is displayed.



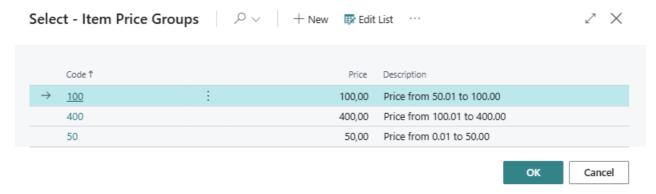
- 12. In this window, you can limit the number of customers for which the markup configured later is used. If you do not make any settings, the markup will be applied to all customers. After setting the filter, return to the markup card.
- 13. The values in the fields **Filtered Customers** and **Total Customers** show you the exact figures for the customers that are stored in the system and the number of customers for which the markup configured later is used.
- 14. Click in the Item Filter field if you only want to apply the markup to certain items.
- 15. The **Filter Page** window is displayed.



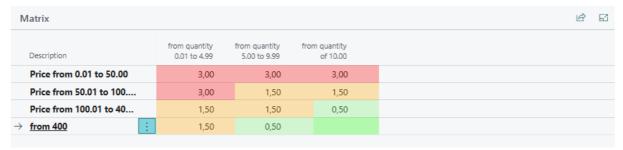
- 16. In this window, you can limit the number of items to which the markup configured later will be applied. If you do not make any settings, the markup will be applied to all items. After setting the filter, return to the markup card.
- 17. The values in the **Filtered Items** and **Total Items** fields show you the exact figures for the items that are stored in the system and the number of items for which the markup configured later will be used.
- 18. Under the **Lines** area, select an item quantity group for the **Quantity Group Code** column. Further information on the selectable values can be found in the section Define item quantity groups.



19. Click on the **Price Group Code** column in the markup card and select a price group. Further information on the selectable values can be found in the section Define item price groups.



- 20. Select a combination of one of the created item quantity groups and one of the created item price groups on the markup card under the **Lines** area.
- 21. Enter the value for the combination under the **Value** column. The value is either a percentage value, a fixed amount or a mixture of the two options. This depends on the setup of the markups under the section Setup Beyond Price Changes.
- 22. The combinations you have entered are displayed under the **Matrix** area. The color highlighting on the following screenshot serves only as an example to illustrate how a percentage matrix has been configured.



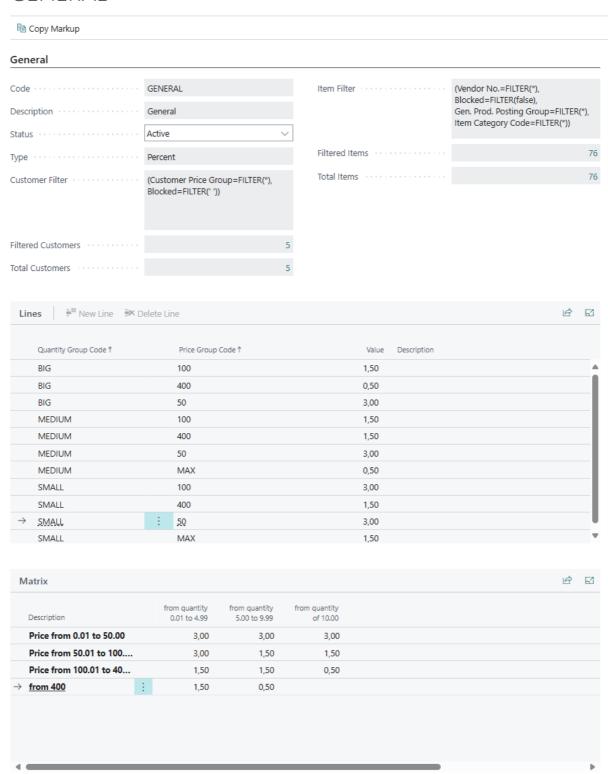
23. To use the configured markup in sales documents, click on the **Verify Lines...** option in the menu bar. The lines entered are checked and the value for the **Status** field under the **General** tab is changed from **Draft** to **Active**.

## Copy Markup

This chapter describes how you can copy an existing markup.

To copy an existing markup, proceed as follows:

- 1. Open the search field (ALT+Q) and search for the page **Markup List**.
- 2. The Markup List page is displayed.
- 3. Select the markup you wish to copy from the list.
- 4. Click on the **Copy Markup** action in the menu bar.
- 5. The **New Code Dialog** window is displayed.

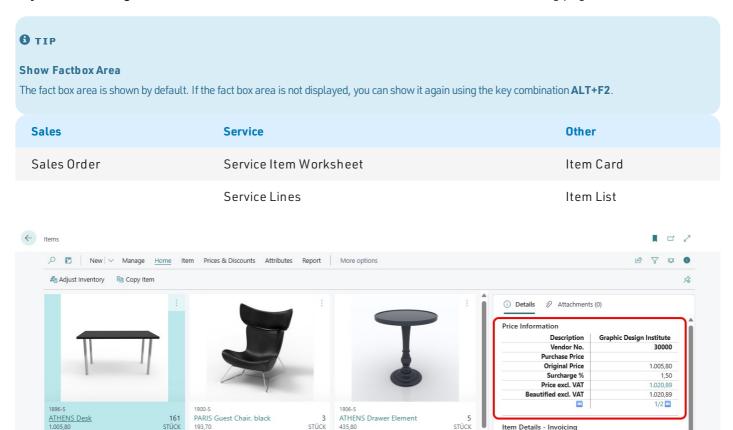

- 6. Enter a code for the copied markup in the **New Code** input field.
- 7. Click **OK** to copy the markup.
- 8. The markmup card of the copied markup is displayed.
- 9. Enter a description for the copied markup in the Description field.

You have copied an existing markup.

### Price Info

Beyond Price Changes adds the Price Information section to the factbox area on the following pages/areas:

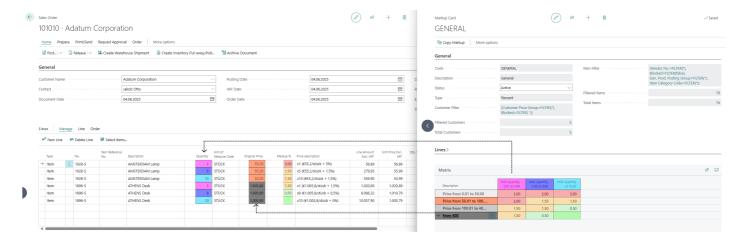


You can use the blue arrow icons at the bottom of the area to navigate between the different price information. Explanations of the displayed lines can be found in the section Markup Setup or in the following explanations.

#### Additional Fields

Once **Beyond Price Changes** has been successfully set up, additional fields are displayed in documents under the **Lines** tab. The fields are:

- Original Price: This column shows the original sales price without markup in documents.
- Markup %: This column indicates the percentage markup for the item line. The markup is taken from the specified value in the surcharge matrix. Further information on the mark-up matrix can be found in the screenshot below.
- **Price Description**: This column shows the basic information used to calculate the line amount. In the first item line in the screenshot below, the value **x1** (€55.2/piece + 3%) is shown. **x1** represents the item quantity, €55.2 is the list price, /piece is the unit code, and 3% is the percentage markup to be applied for this combination of item quantity group and item price group.
